In Tanzania, education saves lives. It opens doors to jobs that sustain entire families. In East Africa, knowledge is more than power – it is freedom.

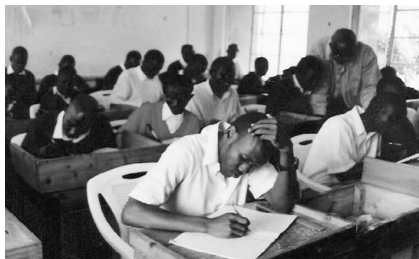


What can you do?

ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

In loving memory of his service to people of God, the **Martin Msseemmaa Memorial Scholarship Fund** has been established by the Northern Illinois Synod. The scholarship fund will pay annual tuition and fees at Moringe Sokoine Lutheran Secondary School in Monduli, Tanzania, for a student who could not otherwise afford to attend.



The school's scholarship committee will meet with potential students and their families. Each male or female student chosen to receive the scholarship must have the ability and the motivation to complete the 6-year program.

Many members of the Northern Illinois Synod have known and been inspired by Martin Msseemmaa's quiet example of loving God's people by establishing and encouraging relationships. The scholarship fund provides such an opportunity by establishing an ongoing relationship between students of Moringe Sokoine Lutheran Secondary School and supporters from the Northern Illinois Synod.
